From Munich Central Station (Hauptbahnhof): Take the urban railway S-6 (S-Bahn) or the regional train (RB) to Tutzing. At the train station in Tutzing, take the Bus 958/978 to "Klenzestraße". You will also find cabs at the front entrance of Tutzing train station. 


From the airport take the urban railway S-1 or S-8 to Munich Central Station and follow the instructions above.
