

The role of labor market and financial frictions for firm responses to globalization: Short-term pain or long-run gain?

Hans-Jörg Schmerer is full Professor of International Economics at the FernUniversität in Hagen. He studied International Economics and Chinese Studies at the University of Tübingen, where he also wrote his Phd thesis on potential labor market effects of globalization. During his time at Tübingen University, he spent one semester as visiting student at University of Nanjing in China and one semester as visiting scholar at University of Nottingham. In 2009 he joined the IAB as research assistant. Additionally, since 2013 he held deputy professorships at the Universities of Passau (Chair of International Economics) and Duisburg-Essen (Chair of East Asian Economic Studies) before taking up the permanent full professorship in Hagen. His main research centers on the examination of the labour market effects of globalization and the Chinese economy. His research appeared in journals such as Journal of Economic Theory, European Economic Review, Scandinavian Journal of Economics.
